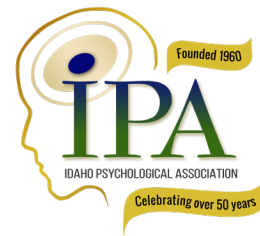


IPA Poster Presentation Competition for Undergraduate & Graduate Psychology Students



Due to COVID-19, IPA's Annual Convention 2022 will be held virtually. Consequently, the poster session will be virtual, too. We're planning to offer a slide show of all student posters for attendees to view a few days before the Convention starts and/or during the lunch break on Saturday. In addition, students will be scheduled to meet with the judges via Zoom to answer questions on their project for the competition. Winners will be announced on Saturday afternoon.

The poster competition at IPA's Annual Convention (April 22 & 23, 2022) has two categories: undergraduate and graduate.

Acceptable Topics: Experimental Research, Clinical Research, and Applied Projects

To Apply: Please submit an abstract with the following headings and information:

- **Presentation title** (limit to 10 words);
- **Purpose, methods, results & conclusions** (limit to 250 words);
- **Presenting author's information** (please include full name, undergraduate or graduate status, snail mailing address, e-mail address & phone numbers); and
- **Name of psychology faculty advisor.**

Applicants for this competition are not required to be student members of IPA; however, we'd welcome your interest in membership.

Awards: \$75 will be awarded to the winner of each competition category: undergraduate and graduate.

Submission Deadline & Information: Abstracts will be accepted starting noon on March 25 and **must be received by noon on April 5**. Submissions should be sent in pdf format to the IPA Office at IPAoffice@idahopsych.org.

Notification of IPA's Decision: IPA will provide feedback to applicants by April 8, 2022. Invited presenters will be contacted by the judges to schedule time for a virtual poster presentation the week of the Convention.

Poster Details: A slide of your poster should be landscape oriented (4:3) and sent in pdf format to the IPA Office by noon on April 18. Please put your references in a pdf handout for distribution to the judges and attendees.

Evaluation Criteria: Professionalism (visual presentation & audience interaction), conceptualization (theoretical foundation & clear hypotheses), methodology, conclusions, and overall value to the field.

Day of Presentation: Your poster will be made available through a slide show to attendees prior to the Convention and at the lunch break on Saturday. Your presentation to the judges will be made via Zoom and will be scheduled closer to the event date. Business attire is recommended.

Student presenters are encouraged to register and attend the entire Convention, as the topics are ones that most will come across in their professional work. Student registration fees vary depending upon the location of the Convention because our costs change (e.g. a breakfast is less expensive in a hospital meeting room than at a Resort or hotel). For planning purposes, early registration rates for students are typically \$70-110 for both days of Convention; **however, they will be much lower for this virtual event**. IPA student members get a discount, so their rates would be on the lower end of that range. If you are not able to attend the full Convention, we hope you will make every effort to support your fellow students by attending the other student presentations (e.g., the oral presentations on Friday afternoon).
